Please observe silence before our service begins, including silencing phones and other devices.

Welcome to Church of the Redeemer. We are glad you're here. We believe that all people are worthy of love and belonging, and we welcome all to this community who share that belief.

Everything you need for worship will be found in this service bulletin or in one of our hymnals. Our 8:00 service is spoken. The 10:30 service has music. Where "hymnal" is listed, we refer to the blue "Hymnal 1982" in the seatback in your pew. Where "WLP" is listed, we refer to the green "Wonder, Love, and Praise" hymnal at your pew. Occasionally, we use additional music resources. When this is the case, we hand the necessary resource to you before the service begins.

You will notice that our congregation worships with body as well as mind and Spirit. Please note that while sitting, standing or kneeling are customary for prayer, we understand that not all bodies are the same. We trust you to make a choice that is right for you.

During communion, all are invited to come forward. If you do not wish to receive, you may simply cross your arms over your chest to receive a blessing instead of bread or wine. If you do not wish to receive the wine, you may choose to go back to your seat after receiving bread only. In our tradition, we believe bread alone confers the entirety of the Eucharistic grace. If you are unable to come forward for communion, simply wave or catch the priest's eye as she scans the room after communion. She will gladly come to you.

We sincerely hope you enjoy worshiping with us today.



The Nicene Creed

Presider and People: Dying, you destroyed our death. Rising, you restored our life. Christ Jesus, come in glory!


