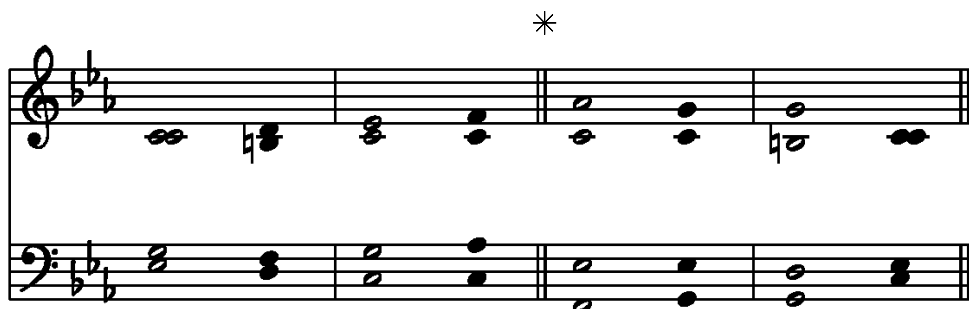

they were afflicted because of their **|sins.**
- \* 18 They abhorred all manner of **|food \***  
and drew near to death's **|door.**
- 19 Then they cried to the Lord in their **|trouble, \***

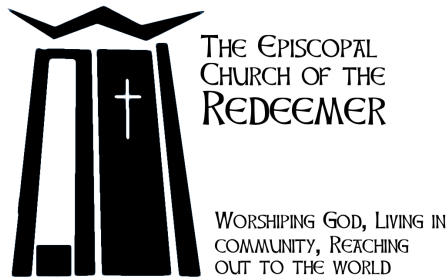
