

The Kingdom of God is with us

Sunday 3rd December 2023, 6pm | All Saints' Cathedral, Nairobi







The Christian season of Advent is the period when we prepare to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ and for His coming in Glory. Much of the service is drawn from ancient sources. Some of the images have been used from the beginnings of Israel, through the period of the New Testament and early Church, through the Middle Ages to the present day. Every age has found in them a new richness through which God's continuous mercy, revealed most dramatically in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus, can be seen.

During this service, the procession moves from West to East, from darkness towards the brightness of sunrise. As it does so, it expresses symbolically our desire to turn away from the darkness in which we are separated from God, and draw closer to the Light. The candlelight in the procession is a reminder of the light of the presence of the incarnate God in our human nature, God with us.

As you prepare for worship, please be sensitive to the needs of those around you who may wish to pray in silence, by refraining from unnecessary conversation.

ORDER OF SERVICE

The service will proceed without any announcements. The congregation is asked to be seated during the Choir Carols and the readings of all lessons except the 7th lesson. At the end of each lesson, the reader will say, "This is the word of the Lord". To which we all respond: "Thanks be to God"

3. BIDDING PRAYER

Beloved in Christ, as we await the great festival of Christmas let us prepare ourselves so that we may be shown its true meaning. Let us hear, in lessons from Holy Scripture, how the prophets of Israel foretold that God would visit and redeem his waiting people. Let us rejoice, in our carols and hymns, that the good purpose of God is being mightily fulfilled.

Let us celebrate the promise that our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ, will bring all men and all things into the glory of God's eternal Kingdom. The blind receive their sight, and the lame walk, the lepers are cleansed, and the deaf hear, the dead are raised up, and the poor have the Gospel preached to them.

But first, let us pray for the world which God so loves, for those who have not heard the good news of God, or who do not believe it, for those who walk in darkness and the shadow of death; and for the Church in this place and everywhere, that it may be freed from all evil and fear, and may in pure joy lift up the light of the love of God.

These prayers and praises let us humbly offer to God, in the words which Christ Himself taught us:

Our Father, which art in heaven, Hallowed be Thy Name, Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done, in earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; And forgive us our trespasses, As we forgive them that trespass against us; And lead us not into temptation, But deliver us from evil. Amen.
