- **R.** [*ring*] Be it unto me according to thy Word. *Repeat "Hail Mary"*.
- **V**. [*ring*] And the Word was made flesh.
- **R.** [*ring*] And dwelt amongst us. Repeat "Hail Mary".
- **V.** Pray for us, O Holy Mother of God.
- **R.** That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

All remain standing while the choir sings from the Chapter Room:


Carol: Jesu, Thou the Virgin-born


